


Taking care of your sewer network in Glenmavis

We are upgrading the waste water infrastructure to support the growth of sustainable new housing in the Glenmavis area of Airdrie. The project will also reduce the risk of sewer flooding by installing nearly 500 metres of new pipework.

Project Overview

We are upgrading the waste water infrastructure to support the growth of sustainable new housing near the Glenmavis area of Airdrie, and reduce the risk of sewer flooding.



The project will deliver benefits for existing customers in the local community by reducing the risk of sewer flooding and will also support the development of the new Berryhill Village on Stirling Road.

Scottish Water is committed to supporting sustainable growth and delivering much-needed improvements for communities and the environment to meet the challenges of climate change, ageing assets and increasing demand.

The project will involve installing over 500 metres of new sewer in three phases over approximately nine months.



Project details

The work is being carried out in 3 phases:



Construct a 107m
long, 1050mm
diameter pipe, at
Raebog Road
(in grass verge)
between Dunvegan
and Windsor Drive





Implement a 168m, 150mm diameter, reinforcement sewer; plus, a 220m long, 225mm diameter, reinforcement sewer along Coatbridge Road and Glenmavis Road





Construct a 50m
length, 525mm
diameter,
reinforcement
storage pipe
upstream of
Woodhead Crescent
CSO, off Glenmavis
Road.

Phase 1





- A 107m long, 1050mm diameter storage pipe
- Off Raebog Road (in grass verge) between Dunvegan and Windsor Drive
- This phase is due to commence from Monday 5 August for a period of 4 months
- This will allow for increased capacity and storage of waste water during spells of heavy rain
- The site will be fenced off using herras fencing and a small welfare unit will be in place
- A road closure will be in place at the entrance to Windsor Drive
- The existing trees will require to be removed, however we are exploring options to enhance the affected area



Phase 2

- A 168m, 150mm diameter, reinforcement sewer; plus, a
 220m long, 225mm diameter, reinforcement sewer
- Along sections of Coatbridge Road and Glenmavis Road
- This phase is due to commence from Tuesday 3 September for approximately six months
- This will be an additional sewer pipe running adjacent to the existing pipe and providing additional capacity to the existing sewer network in the area
- A rolling traffic management programme will be in place to minimise disruption, however delays and parking restrictions are expected.
- Trial digs will take place at the roundabout from Monday
 22nd July for 1 week Traffic management will be in place



Phase 3

- A 50m length, 525mm diameter, reinforcement storage pipe
- Off Glenmavis Road, opposite Woodhead Crescent
- This phase is due to commence from Tuesday 3 September for approximately six months
- This will allow for increased capacity and storage of waste water during spells of heavy rain
- We have completed the relevant environmental surveys for the affected area
- The site will be fenced off and secured using herras fencing
- A site compound will also be set up in the area at the beginning of the project
