Following on from our previous update in February, please find the latest update on progress with the Burncrooks water improvement project.

#### **Environment**

Application for the Controlled Activities Regulation (CAR) licence was submitted to SEPA in December. Draft approval was received this week with the final copy expected in the next couple of weeks.

### Investigations

Ground investigation to confirm the design and final pipe route is now complete. Initial tree and hedge removed commenced on private land early March. Work due to take place within SW land on the eastern side of Craigmaddie reservoir on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March has now been rescheduled to early April. This work will be carried out from 9.30am until 3.30pm to reduce the impact on traffic.

Tree and shrub clearance along the rest of the pipeline route commenced on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March including work within the SSSI in Mugdock Country Park and Craigton Burn. Work around the Allander Water and Craigdhu burn will take place later in April 2019.

We will continue to liaise with East Dunbartonshire Council, Scottish National Heritage and Mugdock Country park during the tree/hedge removal along the pipeline route

The pipeline route has been marked out using small wooden marker posts.

### **Project Timescales**

Preliminary site set up has been established at Bankell with additional site cabins being delivered in the coming days. Start on site is planned for spring 2019.

We will continue to provide regular updates to the local community and stakeholders as we work towards delivering this important project, which will improve services to more than 54,000 customers.
