Meeting with Perth & Kinross Council

Discussions are ongoing with Perth & Kinross Council to investigate the potential for changed junction priorities at the crossroads between Ladeside/Church Brae and Greenbank/Duncricvie Road as well as one way travel along Greenbank Road in an effort to enhance traffic safety during the construction of the upgrade works (pending suitable design and safety assessment).

Road Safety Assessment

To help us achieve our safety objectives, the following Road Safety Assessment has now been carried out. This Assessment will be valuable as our planning for the project's vehicle movements continue.

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Communications with Nature Scotland

Scottish Water received contact from Nature Scot on the environmental aspect of the project. Nature Scot were happy with our initial response and now have a key contact at Scottish Water for any future engagement on the project.

Trial Holes

Ground Investigations are currently ongoing to understand the composition of the land upon which the new works will be built. Design can then be progressed based on what is found from both drilling and trial pitting operations. (pictured opposite).



NEXT STEPS

Planning Application

We are now working towards issuing our planning application to Perth & Kinross Council in March 2023.

Capital Investment Works

Work to improve the Glenfarg treatment process will begin in April within the existing treatment works. This work is separate from the planning application and will take place on a smaller scale with relation to workers and vehicle movements.

Community Liaison Group

We have been in communication with Glenfarg Community Council regarding the setup of a Liaison Group which could come together regularly throughout the project's journey. This would allow us the chance to give key project updates in person, as well as receive questions and feedback from those involved in the community group.
