

Taking care of your sewer network

We are working to protect and enhance the environment of the Firth of Clyde

- We are replacing a short storm outfall with a new screened longer outfall, which will help to improve water quality in the bay.
- Work started in February and is expected to be completed in September 2019.
- The area will be reinstated upon project completion.
- Once complete, this new infrastructure will help prevent items which are wrongly flushed down the toilet items like rags, baby wipes, plastic cotton buds, etc. from overflowing into the sea during severe storm events. The longer outfall will help carry the storm waters further out to sea.

Temporary closure of a section of the beach

Temporary closure of a section of the beach from: 25th March to 12th June 2019. The promenade will remain open.



- A section of beach is required to be closed off to allow us to safely install the new outfall pipe.
- The new outfall pipe will be 220 metres long and is being laid along the seabed from a boat. We are currently working on the barge out at sea to excavate the track out for the extended outfall pipe. The work requires constant excavation and therefore the team require to work over the weekends up to 12th May 2019. There may be some noise during this excavation work.
- Warrenpark Road will remain closed up to the end of August 2019. The promenade will remain open.
- We plan to complete the section of work on the beach and have it opened back up for public access by the 12th June 2019.
- Thank you for your patience whilst we carry out this essential upgrade to the sewer network.




