### Multi-site drought interventions in Lintrathen, Kirriemuir

As you may be aware, we are addressing the low water levels in the Loch of Lintrathen. Over the last 8 weeks, we have been busy installing a large diameter pipe which will allow us to over-pump water to Melgam Burn from the River Isla, allowing us to preserve supply in the Loch of Lintrathen.

#### **Project Progress**

We are pleased to share that we are making good progress, and that approximately 70% of the pipe has now been laid in the carriageway alongside the Loch of Lintrathen despite frequently encountering hard rock while excavating. Our next step will be the construction of the break pressure chamber.



The resurfacing works for this section is underway, and we have completed the first stretch of road near the Wee Bear Café.



We have also been working behind the scenes on Scottish Water land nearby, and this section of pipe laying is also roughly 70% complete.

We have carried out vegetation clearance down to the River Isla to allow us to install a stable access track down to the extraction point.

The pipe installation on and off the carriageway will continue to be in progress simultaneously. The road closure will remain in place until the middle of December, as planned.
