WHAT is happening?

In accordance with the site Odour Management Plan, Seafield WwTW site operators, Veolia, will be undertaking planned cleaning work in the four storm water tanks shown below. The work has been reviewed through an Odour Risk Assessment process and notified to Scottish Water and regulators. The tanks will be sequentially drained and washed over a one day period. The work will be supervised carefully and subject to further review and updates.

WHY are we telling you?

As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours. The storm water tanks are cleaned approximately 10 times per year and whilst this exercise is routine in nature we are providing this specific update in recognition that the tanks came into operation after a prolonged dry spell.

WHEN is this happening?

The tanks will be drained overnight on Thursday 9th August and cleaning is aimed to be completed on <u>Friday 10th August</u> <u>2018</u>.

WHERE is this happening?

The four storm water tanks sit centrally within the treatment plant.
