WHAT is happening?

In accordance with the site Odour Management Plan, Seafield WwTW site operators, Veolia, will be undertaking planned preventive maintenance work on an odour control unit on the 15th and 16th of May. The activity is a routine replacement of the activated carbon which removes odourous compounds from air extracted from parts of the sludge process. The work requires the unit to be taken offline for the duration of the activity. An odour risk assessment has been undertaken and the risk of an odour release in to the community is deemed to be low.

WHY are we telling you?

Based on the weather forecast as summarised below, there is potential for localised odour to be detected during a period of the maintenance programme although this is deemed to be a low risk. As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, however, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours. As this work is a non-standard odour sensitive activity, we want to keep you informed.

WHEN is this happening?

Work will commence on the 15th of May and will continue on the 16th.
