<b>WHAT is happening?</b>		
<p>In accordance with the site Odour Management Plan and statutory requirements, Seafield WwTW site operators, Veolia, will be undertaking planned maintenance for the annual inspection of Stream 2 of the sludge Thermal Hydrolysis Plant. This will involve isolating, depressurising, cleaning and physical inspection of the treatment vessels and pipework.</p>		
<b>WHY are we telling you?</b>		
<p>As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours.</p>		
<b>WHEN is this happening?</b>		
<p>Work will commence on Sunday 13th January 2019 and whilst Veolia shall endeavour to complete this work as soon as possible it may take until Friday 18th January 2019 before the plant will be returned to normal operation. We shall inform stakeholders when this activity has been completed.</p>
