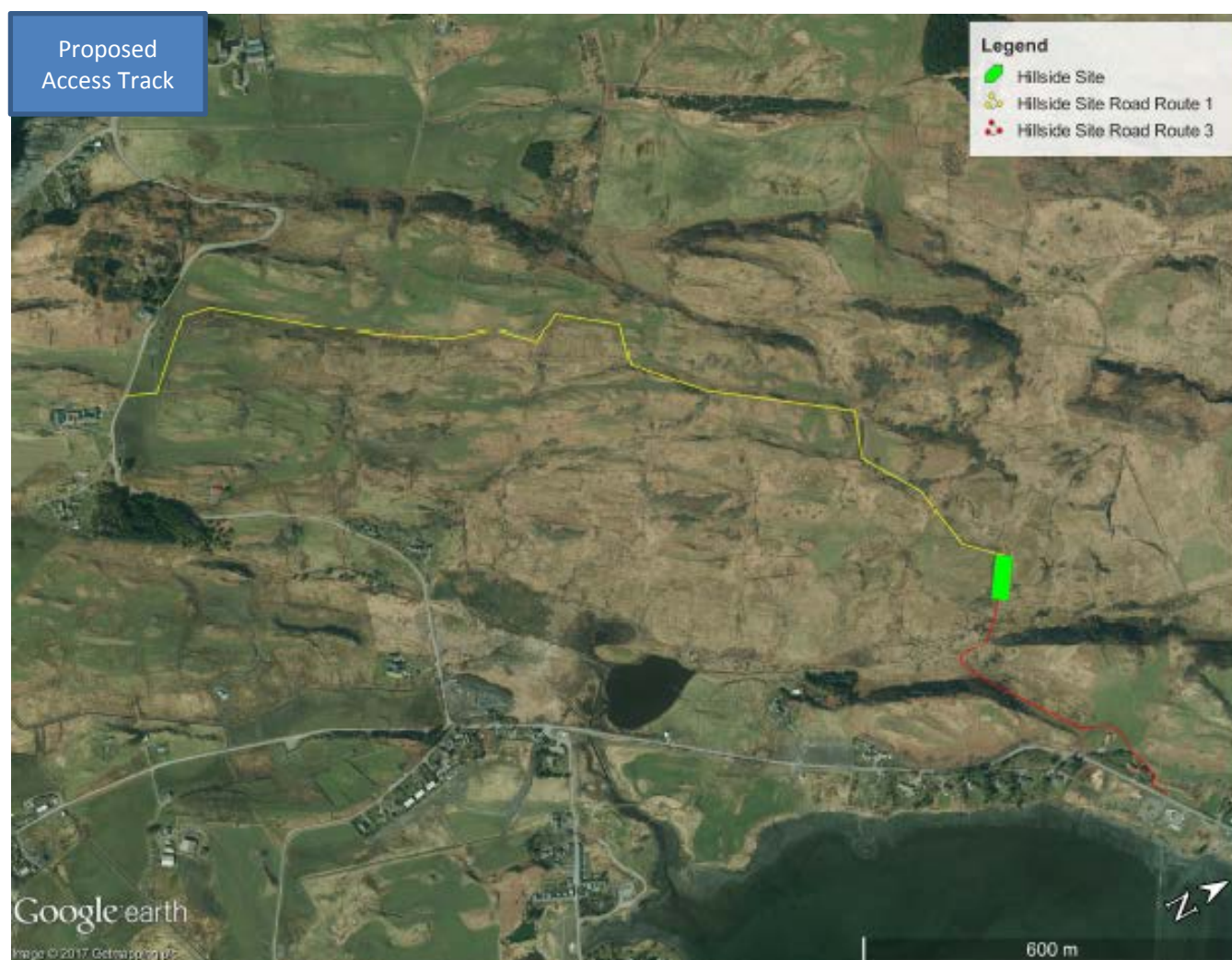
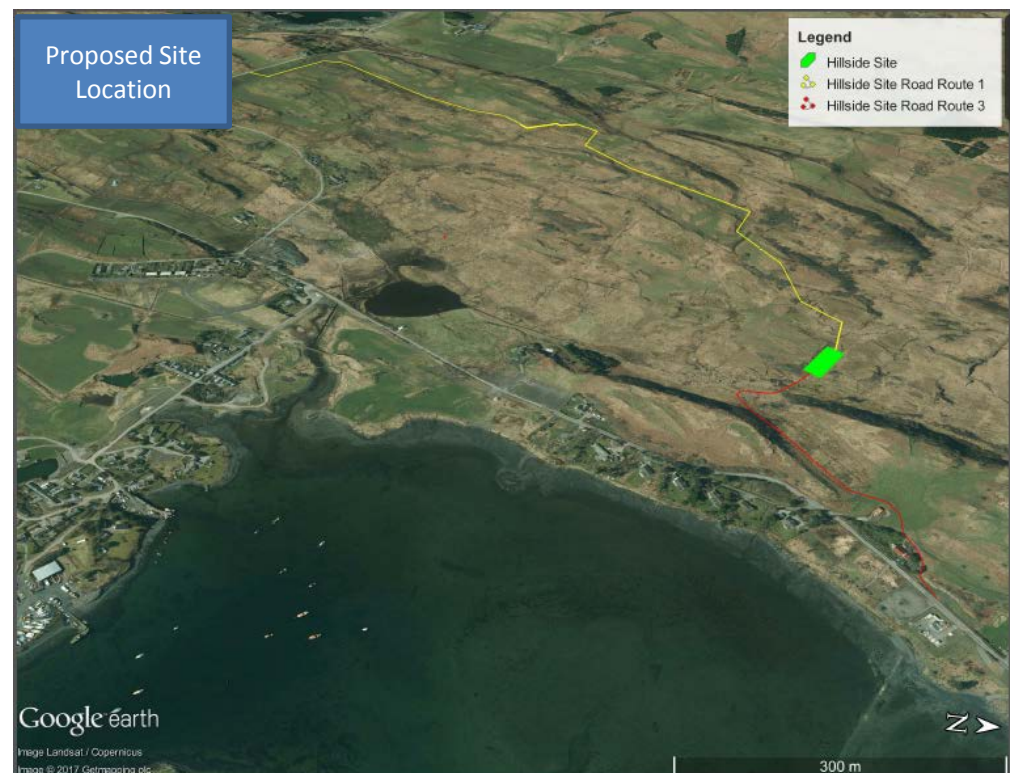


- Why are we here?
- Provide a long term sustainable Waste Water treatment system for the Island of Seil
- Provide first time treatment to the current untreated discharge at Seaview Terrace
- Reduce storm water spills to Balvicar bay
- To communicate and engage with the community and seek feedback

- Completed topographical (Land) survey of the proposed site
- Undertaken an outline road design for the new access road to site
- Liaison with the roads department representatives as part of planning the new access road to proposed site (junction with B844)
- Undertaken site visit, surveying and design work for the septic tank at Seaview Terrace
- SEPA licences – Applications submitted and consultation has now closed for both Seaview septic tank and proposed treatment works



- We previously identified an access track from the south. Approx 2km (Yellow)
- Following feedback at the information event in April we have identified an alternative access route
- We reviewed several alternatives access tracks based on various factors
- The chosen route (Red) is a shorter route and the pipe route will follow a similar path



- Treatment works relocated to landward side of B844 to reduce the visual impact to the local community
- upgrade existing site to underground pumping station with storm storage tank
- Discharge via existing outfall to Seil Sound
- Proposed scheme is subject to land, planning, environmental consents being achieved
- Proximity to properties key to decision making criteria



- New Septic Tank at Seaview using existing Outfall
- Design is underway
- Proposed scheme is subject to land, planning, environmental consents being achieved

- Record and review wider community feedback from this event
- Applications for planning and other technical submissions being prepared
- We will write to the community council to confirm when the applications have been submitted
- Planning submission is likely to be early 2018 for the Seaview septic tank and later in the year for the proposed treatment works - final planning drawings will be able to be viewed on-line and in the village hall
