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Taking care of your water network in Stonehaven

Overview:

- This Project is required to upgrade the water network in Stonehaven to continue to provide high quality drinking water to our customers.
- Work is planned to start approximately **Mid-November 2018**
- Overall, the entire programme of work for this project is expected to take approximately **5-6 months**.
- Due to the rolling nature of the programme, we will notify affected customers prior to works commencing in any particular street.
- This project will see an investment of just under £1m in the local water infrastructure
- Our Alliance Partners **Caledonia Water Alliance (CWA)** will be carrying out this work



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What our work involves:

- Majority of work will be Water Mains Lining with some sections of Open Cut mains replacement.
- Mains lining involves excavating at strategic points along the route of the water main to access the main and spraying the internal surface of the pipe with a lining material.
- These works will be followed by a programme of mains flushing – Flushing works will be carried out at night and have minimal disruption
- There will be general construction noise and traffic in the area throughout the work. We will do all we can to keep this to minimum.



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How our work will affect you:

- Work will involve some disruption to the water supply - all customers affected by any planned interruption to supply will receive notice beforehand
- You may be asked to boil water for a time following a planned interruption. Please follow all information given.
- There will be localised traffic management throughout the works which may include temporary traffic lights and lane/road closures.
- Local access will be maintained. Should there be any time where this is restricted our contractors will liaise with you. Pedestrian Access will be maintained at all times.
- Works to take place Monday – Saturday (traffic management will remain in place out with working times) – exact working hours to be agreed with Aberdeenshire Council
